Term: *al-kimiya* (alchemy)

A key figure is the late 8th century Jābir ibn Hayyān (Latinized as "Geber" or "Geberus").

Jabir introduced a new approach to alchemy, based on scientific methodology and controlled experimentation in the laboratory, which was a forerunner of modern science.

Islamic expansion reintroduced alchemy to Europe.
